The format change also reflects the flexible nature of nursing courses at this institution in meeting criteria in new ways when the situation dictates. Final scores (which included both individual and group points) ranged from 83.7% to 92.7%; the average score was 89.7%. One student scored an 83.7%; one scored 85.4%; the remaining scores were above 86%.
